"I spent most of my career working for a local housing authority, mainly working with families who were in significant social and housing need. This also involved working with refugees, asylum seekers and young people leaving care. I was adopted in the mid 1950s by loving parents who had already adopted a little boy, two years older than me, who became my brother. As an adult my 'family' and child experience included co-parenting my (female) partner's daughter and, through tragic circumstances, being very involved with my nephew's upbringing when he was a toddler. They have both grown up and have families of their own and we no longer all live together, but we have maintained very close, caring relationships and as a result I know that different styles of family do work."

Jeffrey is a social worker whose particular involvement with adoption dates from 1999 when he began work for a national adoption charity, first as director of its southern England team, and then as a director of special adoption/fostering and international projects. He regards adopters as a very precious resource, and adoption as a very positive outcome for children who cannot live with their families and he welcomes the greater attention now being paid to adoption support.
